Through a Child's Eyes

Sometimes little pictures have big ears, and in Esther Freud's new novel Mr Mac and Me they tell a tender and compelling story of an unlikely friendship. Through his young narrator, Jerry Pinto explores the turbulent world of the Indian middle class in Em and the Big Hoom. Porochista Khakpour's The Last Illusion is populated with peculiar children, including a feral boy coming of age in New York, while Favel Parret returns with another achingly sad story of childhood called simply When The Night Comes.

Lessons from the Past

This year history's lessons come in various forms. Biographer Jenny Uglow takes us behind the scenes of the Napoleonic Wars for *In* These Times. Historian Helen Castor joins us with a new biography, Joan of Arc: A History. In All The Light We Cannot See, novelist Anthony Doerr takes us to Paris under the Nazi invasion, and Joan London's The Golden Age picks up after the Second World War as a Hungarian refugee finds his way in Perth.

To Have and To Hold

True to Tolstoy's lament, this year's program brings together a host of unhappy families. A girl goes missing in Linn Ullman's chillingly mysterious The Cold Song, while in Roxanne Gay's shocking novel
An Untamed State, a man foolishly refuses to pay his daughter's ransom. In Jenny Offill's Dept. of Speculation we follow a marriage on the verge of collapse, and troubled twins growing up on Quebec's mean streets are the subject of Heather O'Neill's novel The Girl Who Was Saturday Night.

Great **Powers**

You know what they say about absolute power, and few things corrupt like money. John Lanchester returns with his second volume on the economy, and his aptly titled How To Speak About Money is for those of us who don't enjoy the position of 'insider'. Jane Gleeson-White's Six Capitals tells the story of a 21st-century revolution led by the most unlikely of rebels—accountants. Meanwhile, Michel Faber's powers are faith and redemption, as realised in his brilliant new novel The Book of Strange New Things.

Whodunnit?

Time spent in the dark heart of human behavior makes for great reading. Among the most compelling of these stories is Helen Garner wonderfully complex chronicle of the Robert Farguharson case in This House of Grief, along with Tom Rob Smith's first stand-alone novel *The Farm*, a psychological thriller that lurches between London and rural Sweden. Matthew Condon returns with the much anticipated sequel to Three Crooked Kings-Jack and Jokers—continuing its extraordinary true story.
